Supervisory Use of Force Review

Officers responded to assist Juvenile Probation with the arrest and transportation of a juvenile. The suspect was not cooperative and was verbally aggressive and physically assaultive to Officers. The suspect assaulted one Officer by kicking him and another Officer by spitting on him. The suspect was out of control to the point that an Officer and a Probation Officer had to ride in the back of the patrol car to prevent the suspect from injuring themselves. The suspect kept trying to strike his head on the partition in the patrol car. Officers restrained the suspect to keep him from hurting himself.

The Officer driving made an emergency run to JDC to minimize the amount of time they had with the suspect and reduce the chance that he would hurt himself or an Officer while they had him in custody.

Once at JDC the jail staff asked that the suspect be put on the ground for better control of him. The Officers put the suspect on his stomach. The jail staff took over control of the suspect and put him in a restraint chair.

This resulted in no injury to the suspect. One officer hand a minor hand injury where his hand was caught between the suspect's head and the partition in the car while trying to keep the suspect from hurting himself.
